

THE ARTS SOCIETY GUERNSEY: TERMS & CONDITIONS OF MEMBERSHIP

Membership of The Arts Society Guernsey (“the Society”) is subject to:

- payment of the current annual single or joint membership subscription
- acceptance by the Society of membership applications: the Society reserves the right to refuse any application for membership if the Society considers that to be in the best interests of the Society
- for members joining the Society after the first lecture of the year, the membership subscription will be reduced in proportion to the number of lectures remaining during the year
- membership subscriptions are not refundable; however, the Society reserves the right to cancel any membership and refund the membership subscription in proportion to the number of lectures remaining during the year

Membership can be single or joint. Joint members are defined as two members who have the same postal address.

Members of the Society have the following rights / benefits:

- priority booking for the Society’s lectures during the year
- not to have to pay an entrance fee for the Society’s lectures during the year
- automatic membership of The Arts Society (an arts charity registered in England, Wales & Scotland) without payment of any additional membership subscription
- to receive the quarterly arts review magazine published by The Arts Society, mailed free of charge (normal price £3.50 each)
- to receive news, special offers and other information that may be of interest from the Society and The Arts Society

Potential cap on number of members

The maximum capacity of the venue that the Society has currently chosen for its lectures (the Harry Bound Room at Les Cotils, St Peter Port) is 150 persons: consequently the Society may choose to cap its membership at 150 members - or at any number of members above or below 150 at its discretion - and to introduce a waiting list for new members in accordance with clauses 5(b)(c) of the Constitution & Rules.

Booking system for lectures

The Society reserves the right to introduce a booking system for its lectures, so that it knows in advance (a) how many members will attend each lecture and (b) how many entrance tickets can be sold to non-members in advance. This is in order to maximise the total attendance at each lecture, to ensure that the correct number of chairs are set up in the lecture room and to avoid having to turn anyone away at the door.
