



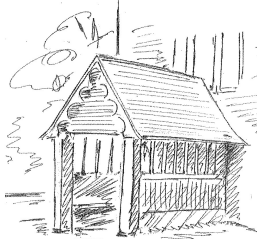

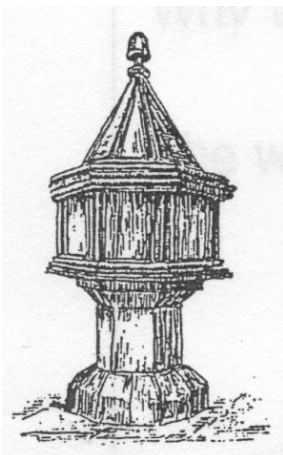

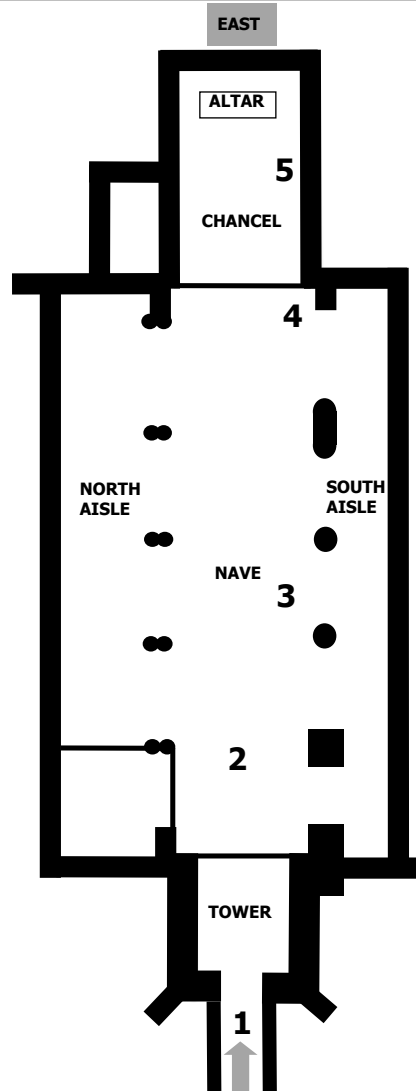

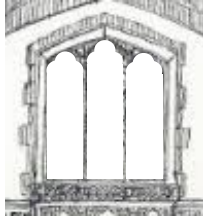

St Lawrence was burned and mark where it is on this plan of the window.

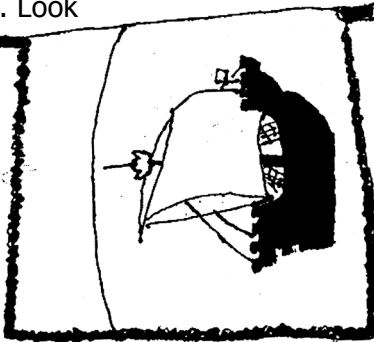


Guess who St Lawrence might be the patron saint of?
