ELISABETH FRINK: HUMANS & OTHERS ANIMALS

A GUIDED TOUR OF THE EXHIBITION AT THE SAINSBURY CENTRE FOR VISUAL ARTS

Wednesday 23 January 2019

This major new exhibition of Suffolk-born artist Elisabeth Frink (1930-1993) features over 130 works by the artist and is the largest showing of Frink's work in 25 years. The exhibition explores Frink's enduring preoccupation with human and animal forms and the symbiotic relationship between them. It provides new perspectives on the key themes found in her work, from responses to the Second World War and the Cold War climate of fear, to the role of man as both aggressor and victim.

Humans and Other Animals examines Frink's radical and bohemian beginnings in 1950s London and traces the evolution of her practice over all four decades of her career, as well as juxtaposing her work with that of contemporary artists, ancient art and other modern masters including Rodin, Picasso, Giacometti, Richier and Bourgeois.

GETTING TO THE SAINSBURY CENTRE

PARKING (see map below)

P7 car park opposite the Sainsbury Centre: free but ensure you obtain a permit from gallery reception
